Pupil Premium Funding 2017/18

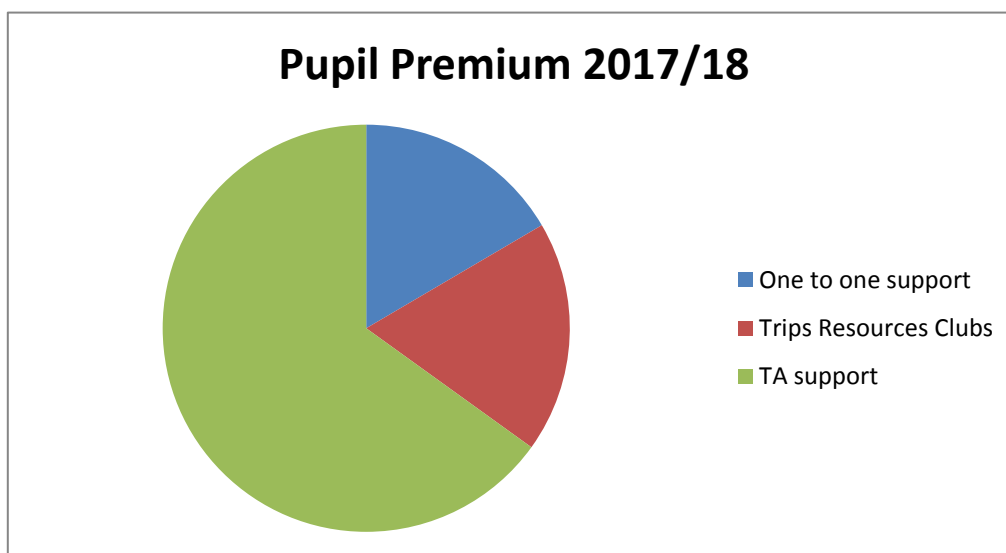
Our school allocation for 2017/18= £6,900

Pauntley C of E Primary School is an inclusive school and strives to:

1. Ensure that teaching, learning and opportunities within the school meet the needs of all our pupils.
2. Ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups; this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
3. Make provision for socially disadvantaged pupils.
4. Recognise that not all pupils who are eligible for funding will be socially disadvantaged.

How may our pupil premium funding be spent?

- One to one tuition by qualified and experienced staff
- Individual or group TA support for personalised learning
- Purchase of intervention programmes and their associated resources led by TAs
- External professional support including assessments and interventions
- Teacher and TA training and courses
- Purchase of resources to help the learning of pupil entitled to the funding
- Subsidising school trips, swimming tuition, music tuition
- Extra-curricular activities



How has the money been spent?

- £1572 on one to one support
- £6179 on TA support in and out of the classroom
- £1746 on funding school trips, extra-curricular clubs and resources

What is the impact of pupil premium spending?

Pauntley is a very small school with very small cohorts, so individual children could be identified if in-depth information is reported on this statement.

- There were eight children entitled to PP funding during the academic year 2017/18.
- The children are assessed against key objectives for writing and maths and complete termly reading assessments.
- Assessment information shows that in reading, seven out of the eight children are working at age related expectations.
- In maths, all the children are working at age related expectations.
- For writing, seven out of the eight children are working at age related expectations.
- Current data shows that the attendance of the group is good overall.
